

Hurtman Rescue (Team)

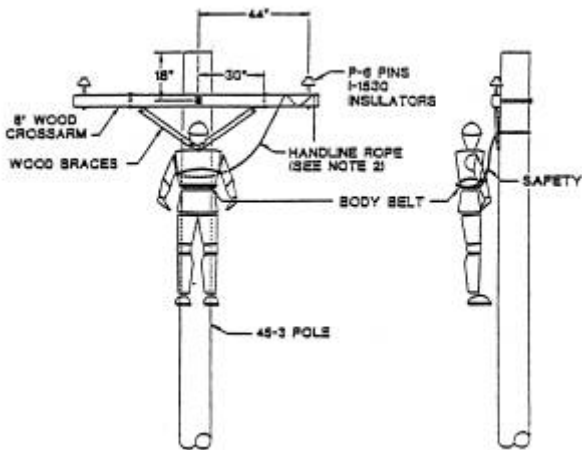
(Mean Time: 4 minutes)

Simulated hot on 40' pole.

Scenario: Lineman has climbed pole and safetied between braces. While hanging handline on arm he has made contact with phase, dropping handline.

1. Time starts at judge's signal with lineman and groundman standing inside the painted circle 10' from the painted circle around the pole. The lineman's belt and hooks will be hanging on a structure simulating hanging in a truck bin, with safety straps snapped into D-ring and belt unbuckled. Structure will be 10' from pole circle.
2. Radio is located in same circle as structure.
3. At judge's signal, lineman retrieves tools and carries them to pole circle. Groundman proceeds to radio to make "mayday" call giving all information (to be provided).
4. Groundman can assist with rescue or lineman can do it alone.
5. The ox block handline will be on the ground in the pole circle. The hurtman will hang in the center of the pole on the crossarm side with safety strap between the braces. Lineman will carry handline up pole and hang on arm using provided sling and hook. **Handline must be carried on break-away hook.**
6. Manikin should be tied under arms with three half hitches. (Eye splice should not be used as part of hitches.) The half hitch is the only acceptable knot.
7. If the hook is to be dropped, it must land in the painted circle at the base of the pole.
8. A Buckingham 488P will be used on the manikin. You must cut the orange insert. See diagram below. **There will be a 10-point deduction for cutting the belt in the wrong place. In addition, the cost of a replacement strap will be the responsibility of the competitor's utility (approximately \$660).**
9. Manikin should be moved smoothly to the ground, without contacting the pole.
10. Time is over when lineman touches the ground in a safe and reasonable manner.
11. When lineman reaches ground, groundman must complete one complete cycle of CPR on manikin (2 breaths, 30 compressions, check pulse).
12. Rope will be furnished for hand lines. Participants must use hand lines provided.
13. Exceeding four minutes to complete the event will result in a 10-point deduction.
14. Judging will start when participants enter the event and continue until they exit the event.
15. **NOTE:** Using a 4" piece of PVC conduit between the rope and the manikin, judges will evaluate the rope knotted around the manikin.
